

The Semi-implicit Cross-scale Hydroscience Integrated System Model (SCHISM) is a next-generation platform to help inform intervention planning by visualizing and predicting the flow of water. ## COVID-19 Relief Fund Flexibility Creates Stormwater Opportunities

Beginning next month, State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) recipients may apply money earmarked for COVID-19 relief efforts to a wider diversity of projects and programs, the U.S. Department of the Treasury recently announced. # State Stormwater Fee Exemption Debate Continues in Pennsylvania

The City of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, imposed an impervious area charge on its customers in late 2020. The Pennsylvania state government, which



owns more than 40% of real estate in Harrisburg, argues that the new charge is an unconstitutional tax rather than a user fee and has refused to pay. The struggle is only the latest example of an ongoing debate between cash-strapped stormwater managers and their states .
